

CONSERVATION LANDS

The Southwest Florida Water
Management District (District)
manages water resources in the westcentral portion of Florida according
to legislative mandates. The District
uses public land acquisition funds to
protect key lands for water resources.
The natural communities, plants and
animals on these lands also benefit
from a level of protection that can be
experienced and enjoyed through
recreational opportunities made
available on District lands.

Every year, approximately 2.5 million people visit the more than 436,000 acres of public conservation lands acquired by the District and its partners. The lands are open to the public for activities such as hiking, bicycling, hunting, horseback riding, fishing, camping, picnicking and studying nature. The District provides these recreational opportunities so that residents may experience healthy natural communities. An array of natural landscapes is available from the meandering Outstanding Florida

Waters riverine systems, the cypress domes and strands, swamps and hammocks, to the scrub, sandhill, and pine flatwoods. The *Common Species on District Lands* brochure provides insight to what you may experience while recreating on public lands managed by the District.






